




Who to contact, when?

Non-essential medical appointments - should be booked outside school hours





Privileges


Start in January 2023

A day in the life of Northwood Sixth Form



3-4 subjects per student

7-9 Hours of lessons per subject, per fortnight (27/36 hours of lessons per fortnight)

Other lessons will be timetabled as **Study Periods** where students work in the study room to complete independent work

Every one hour lesson should be matched with:

- one hour of homework and
- one hour of independent study

Work Experience




- 1 week (5 days) of meaningful work experience.

Extra Curricular Opportunities






The Brilliant Club

Students apply to complete a university-style assignment, tutored by a PhD student. Great for uni applications!

EPQ (Extended Project Qualification)

Optional. Students must apply. Complete a largely self-directed project. Gain important skills, universities love these, and they are worth extra UCAS points (half an A Level).





PEP (Peer Education Project)

All of year 12 are trained and supported to deliver a 5 week course of lessons for y7 students on mental health and wellbeing. Students develop presentation and leadership skills.
