





The day started with a talk by the Chair and Chief Brand Experience Officer which looked at 'what is the advertising and media industry'. This was followed by questions from students (Abi C, Nasser and Max were asking some excellent questions).

As the agency were responsible for the UK marketing and media for the Barbie Movie, the students were handed the original marketing brief from the agency and students had the opportunity to pitch their ideas to three judges. They were all absolutely amazing and did themselves proud.

The winning group: Ella, Olivia M, Mira, Rofay, Theo and Parthvi who won a prize from the agency.


The judges were extremely impressed with Ella's brand activation idea - it was passed back to the managing partner who told the Warner Bros. team "why didn't we come up with that idea".

Students also took part in a Q&A panel with current apprentices and new graduates.









Subject spotlight: PSHCE



This term Years 7 to 10 have focused on citizenship in PSHCE.

Year 7 have explored bullying and anti-bullying, including specific types such as racism. In

lessons there were some great group presentations!

Year 8 have revisited their Year 7 learning about diversity, difference and inclusion in society.

They have also learnt about the law and democracy, including the role of the police and punishment of young offenders. Year 8 had a whole day of workshops entitled 'Your Life You

Choose'

Year 9 have revisited their Year 8 learning on law and democracy and moved on to explore issues of extremism and radicalisation. Year 9 have been lucky to experience two hours of workshops on anti-discrimination from the fabulous charity StandUp! Education.

Year 10 have explored global issues in their unit titled: 'issues at home and abroad'. This included topics such as migration, conflict and the economy. Extending this learning, Year 10

have moved to learning about different types of extremism and vulnerabilities to radicalisation. Year 10 have received four hours of workshops from the charity St Giles SOS+.

Year 11 have revisited the core statutory topics of healthy relationships and consent, as well as having subject intervention in their PSHCE lessons.









PSHCE Year 8 - Your Life You Choose



On Wednesday 22nd November, Year 8 had an incredible day of workshops. Each form group received 5 sessions, including from our Safer Schools Officer, Hillingdon Youth Justice Service, the Youth Engagement Team, Magistrate Judges, SORTED (the substance misuse charity) and London Ambulance Service.



This event, entitled Your Life You Choose, fell on our careers spotlight day, providing students with contact with people in various careers within the public services.

Careers Spotlight



For Northwood's frist Careers Spotlight event this year, we put the spotlight on Careers within the **Public sector**.

Students explored a range of careers in the public sector across their subjects. Some examples of the fantastic careers and skills are students explored are:

Fieldwork in geography - landscape architects, town planners

Civil Engineering - Building a structurally sound bridge.

Computer science explored the roles of Network and Software engineers, as well as nanotechnologists.

DT looked at the work of NHS Nutritionists, BBC set/costume designers and the applications of 3D printing in medicine.

English looked at management skills and how these apply to characters in texts that students are studying.
