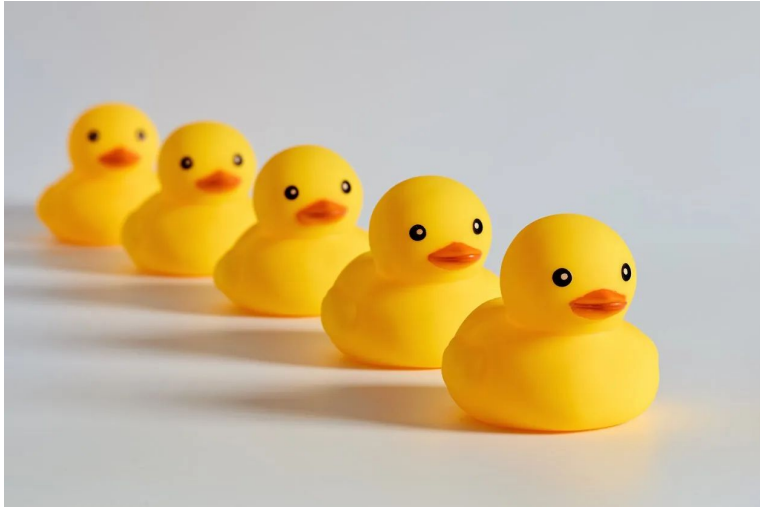

- Gender reassignment
- Marriage or civil partnership
- Pregnancy and maternity
- Race
- Religion or belief
- Sex
- Sexual orientation

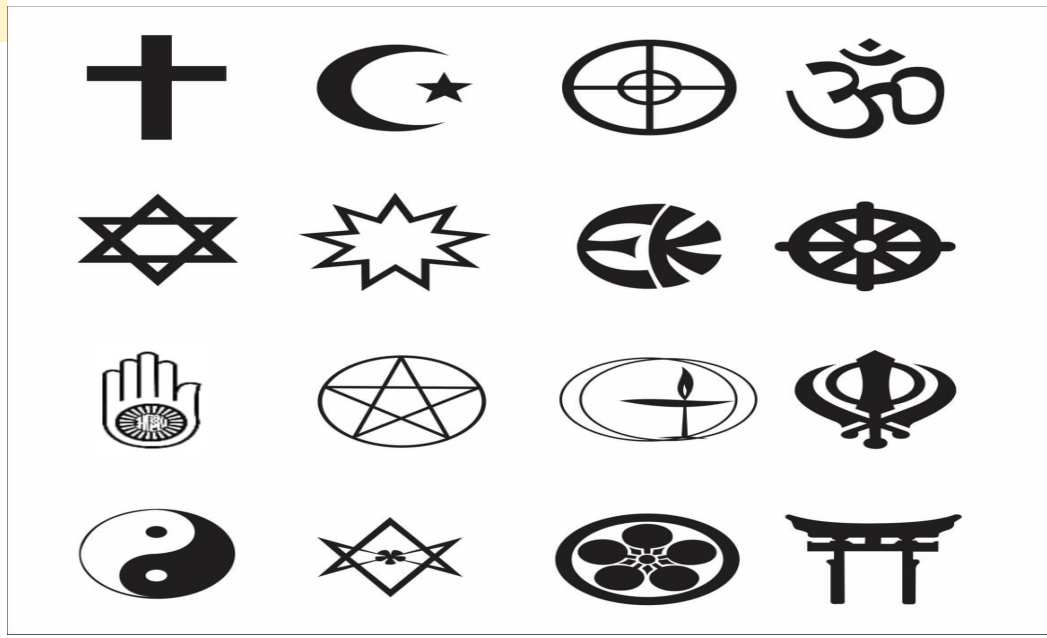

- The census introduced a **voluntary question on religion in 2001**.
- In the census data, religion refers to a person's religious **affiliation**. This is the religion with which they connect or identify, rather than their beliefs or active religious practice.
- **London** remains the **most religiously diverse region of England in 2021**, with over a quarter (25.3%) of all usual residents reporting a religion other than “Christian”; the North East and South West are the least religiously diverse regions, with 4.2% and 3.2%, respectively, selecting a religion other than “Christian”.

Jews (1.65%)

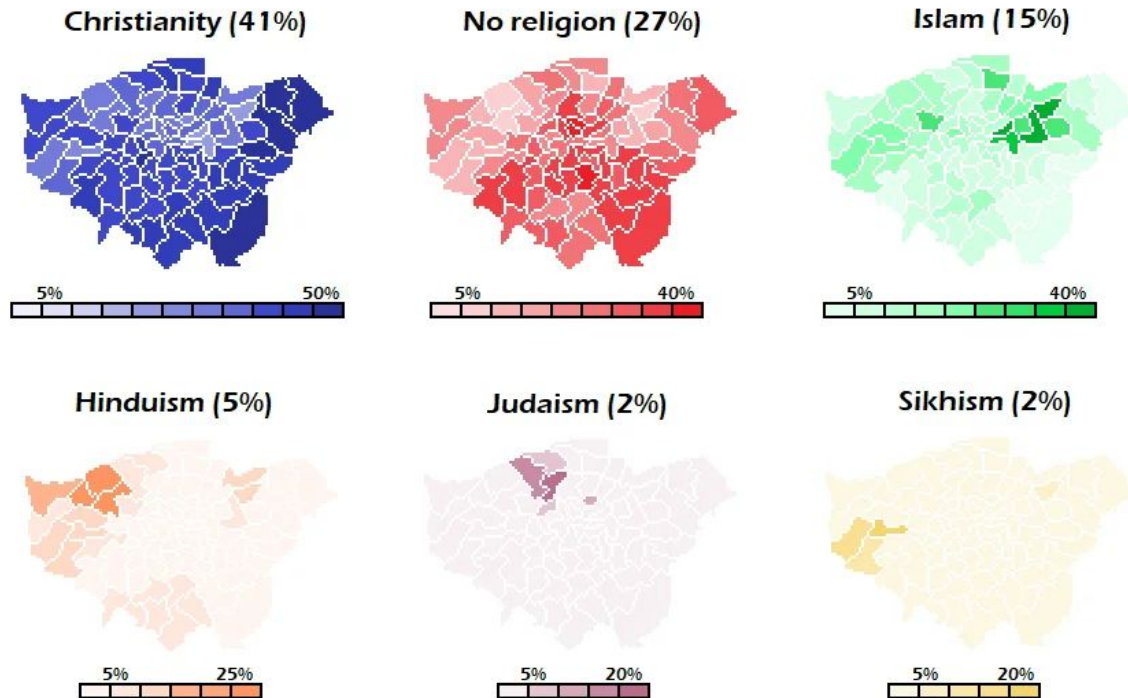

Religion in London (2021 Census)

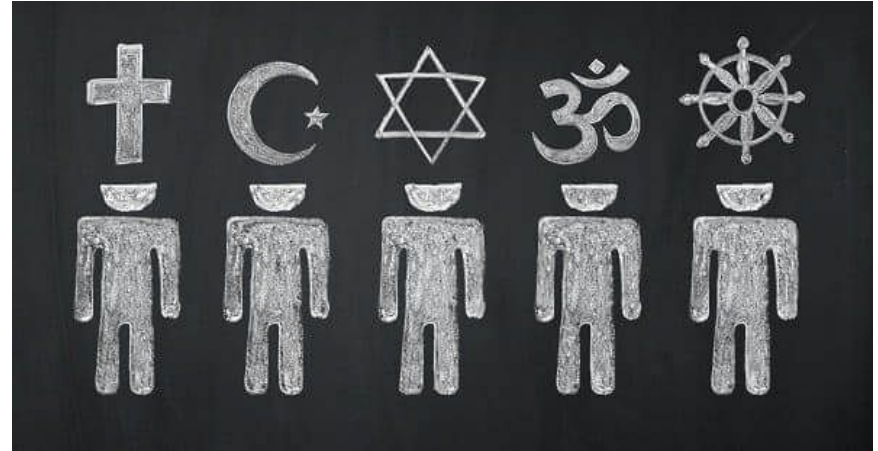


Understanding the importance of religious beliefs
