

Equality


Equality is about ensuring that every individual has an equal opportunity to make the most of their lives and talents. The Equality Act 2010 sets out that the nine characteristics that are protected are:

- Age
- Disability
- Gender reassignment
- Marriage or civil partnership
- Pregnancy and maternity
- Race
- Religion or belief
- Sex
- Sexual orientation









Office for National Statistics - Census



• The census introduced a voluntary question on religion in 2001.

• In the census data, religion refers to a person's religious **affiliation**. This is the religion with which they connect or identify, rather than their beliefs or active religious practice.

 London remains the most religiously diverse region of England in 2021, with over a quarter (25.3%) of all usual residents reporting a religion other than "Christian"; the North East and South West are the least religiously diverse regions, with 4.2% and 3.2%, respectively, selecting a religion other than "Christian".






